

## **Kennebec Leadership Institute**

Training for Tomorrow's Leaders

January 30-May 4, 2016





The concept of a leadership program is to assure a continuing flow of able, vigorous, and resourceful leaders in the Kennebec Valley area. As the oldest such leadership program in the state, the Kennebec Leadership Institute (KLI) draws prospective leaders from a cross-section of businesses, organizations, and the community at large.

KLI is an intensive, three month (80 hour) training program that requires 100% commitment from its participants. It is designed to give participants the knowledge and skills necessary to become more effective community leaders. KLI is a joint effort of the Kennebec Valley Chamber of Commerce and the University of Maine at Augusta.

#### **Program Content:**

- 1. *Leadership Skill Building*: Taught in two weekends (opening & closing) and four full-day sessions that focus on building participants leadership skills and talents.
- 2. *Kennebec Valley Issues*: Taught in eight Wednesday evening sessions. A series of panel discussions with top business and community leaders, each focusing on a specific topic or aspect of life and work in the Kennebec Valley.

#### 2016 Program Information

The deadline for completed applications is **September 15, 2015**. Tuition for the 2016 program is \$1400 and KLI may have partial scholarships available – call the KV Chamber for details. The applications will be reviewed as they are received and a screening committee will interview finalists.
